In doing so, we seek to advance both sustainable regional development and the creation of necessary conditions for lasting peace in our region. FoEME has offices in Amman, Bethlehem, and Tel-Aviv. FoEME is a member of Friends of the Earth International, the largest grassroots environmental organization in the world.

With assistance from the Mount Zion Foundation FoEME will further efforts to rehabilitate the Lower Iordan River. The Lower Jordan River, from the Sea of Galilee to the Dead Sea, has had 98% of its fresh water resources diverted. All that is presently left flowing in the Lower Jordan - a river considered holy to half of humanity - is agricultural run-off, diverted saline waters and untreated sewage. The Jordan River's rich spiritual and cultural connections to lewish, Christian and Muslim faith based communities provide a foundation for a strong inter-faith coalition focused on the need to rehabilitate this important natural and cultural heritage landscape.

Mount Zion Foundation / Mount Zion Award

The Mount Zion Award for reconciliation was founded in 1986 by Wilhelm Salberg, a Catholic Priest from Essen (Germany), who died in 1996. The Award has been presented biannually since 1987 to individuals and institutions that made an outstanding contribution to the enhancement of dialogue between the different religions and cultures in the Holy Land and of mutual understanding between Jews, Christians and Muslims.

The presentation always takes place at the end of October, because on October 28, 1965, the 2nd Vatican Council published the text "Nostra Aetate" which attracted much attention. With this "Declaration concerning the relationship of the church towards the non-Christian religions", the Latin Church adopted a new attitude towards Judaism, Islam and other religions, which is characterized by respect.
