<b>General impression</b> Please describe your stay in 4-5 sentences	Lucerne was a beautiful city with fantastic scenery and close proximity to the university, train station, bars and restaurants. I had the opportunity to stay for 2 semesters and enjoyed what the city had to offer during winter and spring. Although most things in Lucerne (and Switzerland in general) were quite expensive, I managed to budget and enjoy myself at the same time.
<b>Entry/arrival in Switzerland</b> Immigration formalities, visa, health insurance	Entry into Switzerland was easy and the University was really helpful in making sure we had completed all the formalities in the required time. As an EU student, a visa and health insurance were not required which was an added benefit.
<b>Searching for rooms/ accommodation</b> Experiences and useful addresses	I stayed at the Student Mentor Foundation Lucerne accommodation, which I found to be perfect. This is because it was very close to the bars and the university, which made it easier to get around compared to the Emmenbrucke accommodation which was slightly longer and required you to take either a bus or train to get there.
<b>Public transportation</b> Train, bus, accessibility of university buildings	The public transport in Switzerland was great. I would recommend buying the Half-Fare card if you will be travelling around Switzerland as it will save you a lot of money in the long run.
<b>Prearrangements</b> Registration for courses, academic records	Registration to courses was slightly different from my home university. However, the law faculty are really helpful if you are struggling with registration etc.
<b>Information on the university</b> Location, size, infrastructure	The university building is located next to the train station. In comparison to my home university, which has around 27,000 students, Lucerne has a substantially smaller amount of students.
<b>German course at the University</b> "German Short Course" and/or A1 German Course visited? Content of course, use?	The German course was useful in some respects. For instance, it provided you with a good insight into the things to do in Switzerland and the dos and don'ts based on the Swiss culture. However, I felt it was difficult to really learn the Swiss German over the three-day period.
<b>Studying at the university</b> Content of lectures, credits, assessments	I had to take quite a few courses, as I needed to make up 30 credits. The assessments were oral exams, which I thought were really interesting and different to the usual way of being assessed.
