As I mostly visited German courses, I also got in contact with Swiss students which was very interesting.
<b>Budgeting</b> Living costs, study material, money transfer	Compared to my home country, the living costs are quite high, but with the grant you receive and by buying not always in the most expensive stores you get along with it rather well (e. g. grocery shopping in Aldi or Denner is quite affordable). I also recommend opening a Swiss bank account (e. g. with the UBS or the Kantonalbank) which makes for example money transfers easier. You can close it again easily when you leave.
Living/ leisure Meeting places, sports, culture	I enjoyed the university's sports program; most courses are for free and they offer a lot of different activities. Going out in Lucerne with its many bars and clubs is fun but you should consider higher costs than you might be used to. I also went to the theatre once and there are certain interesting museums in the city. Finally, the lake itself is probably one of the most prominent spots and must be very beautiful during summer time!

I liked the small courses in Lucerne which make e. g. discussions very intensive and the contact to teachers was closer than at my home university.
