Entry/arrival in Switzerland Immigration formalities, visa, health insurance	I arrived to Switzerland with an Indian passport. Before two months of the arrival, I sought the Swiss visa, which I was easily granted due to the detailed instructions from the University of Lucerne. On arrival, the immigration formalities were minor. The Swisscare health insurance was very economical and ensured a good protection.

It was really easy to access the University premises. In general, the public transport in Switzerland is commendable, with services being punctual and comfortable.

Moreover, there was a chance to try courses to determine interest in them before actually taking an exam in the same.
Information on the university Location, size, infrastructure	The location of the University was right next to the railway station, making it extremely accessible. The University is not as big in size but contains all the essential elements in the form of classes, seminar rooms etc. Additionally, the infrastructure of the University is modern and quite attractive with modern settings within classes and corridors.
